Bemrose Trail System

Bemrose Trail – 9036
Hoosier Comsite Road – 848W.1

Difficulty: EASY

Trail Use: Low

Length: Bemrose Trail – 3.0 mi., Hoosier Comsite Trail – 0.7 mi.

Elevation: The Hosier Pass parking area is at 11,539 feet. The highest point is at 11,560.

Elevation Gain: 21 feet

Open In Winter To: X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

Open In Summer To: HIKING, HORSE, MTN. BIKING (EXCEPT FOR 848W.1)

Access:

- From I-70, take Exit 203, Frisco / Breckenridge and travel south on Highway 9 through Frisco and Breckenridge to Hoosier Pass (approximately 19.5 miles).
- Park in the area provided. Be careful crossing the highway.

Trail Highlights:

- The trails pass through stands of aspen and lodgepole pine.
- For the first 2 miles, the Bemrose Trail follows the contour, then drops 460 feet in one mile.
- The upper half of the Hoosier Comsite Road is above timberline.

Important information:

- The Hoosier Comsite Road is only open to hiking and horseback riding. It is closed to mountain bikes because this area is part of a natural research area with very sensitive plant species.
- Mountain bikes may only be used on trails marked with a mountain bike symbol. If there is no sign, it is closed to that use.
- Dog owners - Please be considerate of other trail users. Keep your dog in sight and when you encounter others, call the dog to your side until they pass. Use a stick to remove dog feces from the trail.
