## Golden Horseshoe West Trail System

Upper Flume – #GH-2 Toxic Forest - #GH-7 Hard Luck #GH-100  
 Pelican – GH-101, Upper Preston Way – #GH-14, Fall Classic – #GH-11  
 Slalom Singletrack - #GH-3 Little Corporal - #GH-4 Betty's- #GH-18

**Difficulty:** EASY TO MORE DIFFICULT

**Trail Use:** Moderate

**Length:** Upper Flume – 0.6 mi., Toxic Forest - 0.2 mi., Hard Luck - 0.3 mi Pelican– 0.3 mi., Upper Preston Way – 0.6 mi., Fall Classic – 0.5 mi., Slalom Singletrack - 0.5 mi., Little Corporal - 0.3 mi., Betty's - 0.6 mi.

**Elevation:** The French Gulch Road is at 9,720 feet. The highest point is at the Slalom Singletrack / Fall Classic junction at 10, 200 feet.

**Elevation Gain:** 480 feet.

**Open In Winter To:** See winter ROG for over-the-snow uses

**Open In Summer To:** HIKING, HORSE, MTN. BIKING

**Access:** Town of Breckenridge

- From I-70 take Frisco exit 203 and follow signs for CO Hwy 9 to Breckenridge. Travel approximately 8.5 miles to the Town of Breckenridge. Turn right (west) on Valley Brook Road, then drive 1/4 mile to a T-intersection (Airport Road). Turn left on Airport road, then turn left again after 100 yards. Park at the Breckenridge Recreation Center.

### Trail Highlights:

- The trails pass through stands of lodgepole pine and aspen.
- There are numerous historic mining structures.

### Important information:

- Historic buildings and artifacts are protected by Federal law. Do not remove or damage any cultural resource. Be sure to bring a camera to record the images of mining life in the 1860s.
- Mountain bikes may only be used on trails marked with a mountain bike symbol. If there is no sign, it is closed to that use.
- Dog owners - Please be considerate of other trail users. Keep your dog in sight and when you encounter others, call the dog to your side until they pass. Use a stick to remove dog feces from the trail.
- All of the roads and some trails in the Golden horseshoe are open to off highway motorcycles and ATVs.
