Trail Use: Moderate

Length: Length: Soda Creek Trail – 6.0 mi., Fallen Soldier Trail – 0.9 mi.,
 Groovy Uvi Trail – 0.9 mi., Shadow Catcher Trail – 0.8 mi.,

Elevation: The trails start at 9,120 feet and ends at 9,320 feet The highest point is 9,460 feet.

Elevation Gain: 340 feet

Open In Winter To: X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

Open In Summer To: HIKING, HORSE, MTN. BIKING

Access #1: Whispering Pines Trailhead (Summit County Open Space)

- From I-70, take Exit 205, Silverthorne / Dillon and travel south on Highway 6 for approximately 2.1 miles
- At the traffic light, turn right on the Swan Mountain Road (towards Breckenridge) and proceed 0.1 miles.
- Take the second left onto Cove Blvd. (into Summit Cove Subdivision). This is a residential area and the speed limit is 25 miles per hour.
- Proceed approximately 1 mile and turn right onto Whispering Pines Ranch Road
- Proceed approximately 0.3 mile and turn right at the stop sign onto Forest Glen Road.
- The trailhead is on the left (about 0.1 miles).

Access #2: Summit Elementary School

- From I-70, take Exit 205, Silverthorne / Dillon and travel south on Highway 6 for approximately 2.1 miles
- At the traffic light, turn right on the Swan Mountain Road (towards Breckenridge) and proceed 0.1 miles.
- Take the second left onto Cove Blvd. (into Summit Cove Subdivision). This is a residential area and the speed limit is 25 miles per hour.
- Proceed 1.2 miles and the trailhead is on the right.

Trail Highlights:

- The Soda Creek Trail has several small creek crossings and has views of open meadows.

Important information:

- Please respect the residents near the trailheads. Be quiet and keep dogs leashed until you are on the trail.
- The northern end of the Soda Cr. Trail drops onto the Keystone Ranch Road at the ranch entrance arch.
- Mountain bikes may only be used on trails marked with a mountain bike symbol. If there is no sign, it is closed to that use.
- Dog owners - Please be considerate of other trail users. Keep your dog in sight and when you encounter others, call the dog to your side until they pass. Use a stick to remove dog feces from the trail.
