## Windy Point Area Trail System

**Windy Point Trail - #9130**  
**Wagonwheel Trail – #9121**

**Bouldering Trail – #9038**  
**Busted Axel Trail – #9168**

**Difficulty:** EASY

**Trail Use:** Moderate

**Length:** Windy Point Trail – 0.6 mi., Bouldering Trail – 0.5 mi., Wagonwheel Trail – 0.4 mi.,  
 Busted Axel Trail – 0.2 mi.

**Elevation:** The lowest elevation is along the Lake Dillon shoreline which is at 9000 feet. The highest point is on the Bouldering Trail at 9,280 feet.

**Elevation Gain:** 280 feet

**Open In Winter To:** X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

**Open In Summer To:** HIKING, MTN. BIKING

**Access #1:** Prospector Campground

- From I-70, take Exit 205, Silverthorne / Dillon and travel south on Highway 6 for about 2.1 miles.
- At the traffic light, turn right on the Swan Mountain Road (towards Breckenridge) and proceed 2 mi.
- Turn onto the Prospector / Windy Point Campground road and proceed about 0.5 miles and turn left into Prospector Campground.
- Just past the fee station, there is a parking are on the right (There is no fee to park).
- The Wagonwheel Trail begins at the end of Loop A or Loop D.

**Access #2:** Swan Mountain Road

- From I-70, take Exit 205, Silverthorne / Dillon and travel south on Highway 6 for about 2.1 miles.
- At the traffic light, turn right on the Swan Mountain Road (towards Breckenridge) and proceed 2 mi.
- Turn onto the Prospector / Windy Point Campground road.
- The trailhead is on the right by the gate.

**Trail Highlights:**

- The trails offer views of Lake Dillon
- The trails pass through stands of lodgepole pine.
- The Bouldering Trail has numerous rocks for bouldering and some smaller ones for kids to climb on.

**Important information:**

- Horses are not allowed on these trails because of the proximity to the campgrounds.
- Mountain bikes may only be used on trails marked with a mountain bike symbol. If there is no sign, it is closed to that use.
- Dog owners - Please be considerate of other trail users. Keep your dog in sight and when you encounter others, call the dog to your side until they pass. Use a stick to remove dog feces from the trail.
