ANGLER MOUNTAIN - FDT 29

Difficulty: MODERATE

Trail Use: MODERATE

Length: 2.5 miles one-way

Elevation: Starts at 8,620 feet and ends at 9,820 feet

Elevation Gain: +1,200 feet

Open To: HIKING, HORSE

Access:

- From I-70 take Exit 205, Silverthorne / Dillon, and travel north on HWY 9 for approximately 2.1 miles (1.3 miles past the Dillon Ranger Station).
- Just past a sign that reads "GOLF COURSE," turn right onto Bald Eagle Road. This is a residential area and the speed limit is 25 miles per hour.
- Proceed approximately 1/2 mile to the trailhead on the right. Park here.

Trail Highlights:

- The Angler Mountain Trail offers spectacular views of the Gore Range and Silverthorne.
- There are numerous colorful wildflowers in July.
- The trail passes through stands of aspen and lodgepole.
- Upon reaching the end of the trail, you will come to the Ptarmigan Trail (#35) which accesses the Ptarmigan Wilderness.

Important Information:

- The Angler Mountain trail is closed to mountain bikes, however, they may be encountered on the Ptarmigan Peak trail.
- The section of the trail from the trailhead to the Forest boundary (at the fence that crosses the trail) is on private property. Please stay on the trail.
- There is no parking for horse trailers at the trailhead.
